EVANGELISM

Ka Hana 'Euanelio (The work of sharing the Good News)

Provide a worship experience which imparts a sense of Hawaiian culture, heritage and aloha.

Use culture, celebrations, and special events to bring the spirit of worship in the church to the community

EDUCATION

Ho 'onā 'auao me Ho 'akea 'ana (To teach and to enlighten)

Provide opportunities in Christian education for all church members

Provide leadership training for clergy, laity and the community

Encourage youth and young adult ministries

Help make people aware of Christian education and ministerial career opportunities and to encourage their participation

Hāpai a Ho 'onui 'E (To lift and enlarge)
