

### A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

### CLARA D. PRIESTER

God continues to masterfully order my footsteps in ways that I could never fathom and He is doing the same for our WBM. Isaiah 55:8 reads, "For my thoughts *are* not your thoughts, neither *are* your ways my ways, saith the LORD." There is a full spectrum of limitless possibilities in serving Him and while we have accomplished much in the past year, I am excited about what lies ahead. We certainly have much more to do, but I am so very grateful for all that God has already done in further establishing, and in some cases, reestablishing our WBM with our partners, churches and others in the community.

In May, after receiving an e-mail from Warden Patterson, I attended the Women's Community Correctional Center (WCCC) Counselor Training with Melinda, our Missions Chair and Tracey Holcomb, President of Sisters Going Deeper in God and new WBM member. The training was organized and conducted by Chaplain Tammy Turcios who oversees the Total Life Recovery Program (TLR), a faith-based ministry to women in the facility. It was an incredibly enlightening training and greatly beneficial in ministry. We heard powerful testimonies of the healing power of God in the lives of several women. Many of them have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior. Lillian was one of these women. She had been incarcerated for several years and was moving on to TJ Mahoney, a program that prepares women for reentry. She applied for work and was hired by a local church that created an administrative position especially for her. Lillian continues to thrive, but is always careful to acknowledge God for His guidance and provision and her successes. We have been able to gift her and Dione, another program participant with toiletries and financial gifts in partnership with Sisters Going Deeper in God. On June 25, I was Lillian's guest at a "Building A Beloved Community Dinner" at Kaumakapili Church. What an honor this was for me. I will be meeting with Lorraine Robinson, Executive Director of TJ Mahoney, on July 9 to talk about how we can work more effectively in stewarding our resources to help more of the women in this program. I continue to receive updates from Lillian and Dione about their progress and have opportunities to pray with them. This is the joy of ministry – witnessing the transformational and restorative power of God in the lives of people.

I am pleased to report that I have met and continue to meet with Pastor Odette Carasquillo (Center of Light Christian Ministries), Reverend Debra Murray (United Methodist Church), Pastor Karlyn Miyashiro (Island Women Empowered by God), Kelly Pagaragan (missionary in Japan), Caleb Ludwig (missionary in Guam), Norina Barcenas (Wings International – help for Domestic Violence survivors), Dr. Gina Camara and Haneefbilal (Acute Mental Health Unit at WCCC), Rose Colquitt (Substance Abuse Program at WCCC), Su Atta and Annie England (PACT/Family Peace Center), Debbie Smith (Youth Outreach Center), Sisters Going Deeper in God, Veronika Geronimo, Executive Director of the Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence, Donna Gamboa (Windward Spouse Abuse Shelter), Riane Cardenas (Executive Director of a new non-profit providing help to families of Domestic Violence), Kehaulani Coleman (Director of Economic Advancement Programs, YWCA), and more. Our partnerships create opportunities for me to share the ministry of our WBM, garner more support, and work collaboratively to further our reach. The needs in our communities are so great and it requires all of us working together to do more. My regular meetings also include our amazing Finance Committee and working very closely with Melinda, our Missions Chair. How very grateful I am for the dedication of all of these servants.

On Sunday, June 23, I attended a service at Waipahu UCC where I presented a check from our WBM for Kelly Pagaragan. She was unable to be there, so her mother and mother-in-law received the check on her behalf. Reverend Norma DeSaegher and I had an inspiring exchange after the service and I was able to share a WBM update with her. Other WBM members that I visited with there were Sachi Fujita, Irene Nomura, and Rose Pamatigan.

With God's direction and anointing, and the faithfulness of so many of you, I believe that greater things are on the horizon for our WBM. May God grant you blessings of peace, health, and extraordinary moments.

### OUR 142<sup>ND</sup> ANNUAL MEETING

More than 65 women and a few husbands attended our Woman's Board of Missions for the Pacific Island's 142<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting, held on Saturday, May 18, 2013 at the Central Union Church Parish Hall. The theme of the event was "Called to Holiness" and the festive red decorations with beautiful imagery of hula dancers delighted all present. The scripture was taken from 1 Corinthians 15:34 which states, "Think straight. Awaken to the holiness of life."

Pianist Barbara Chong-Gossard launched the event with a beautiful musical prelude. Eleanore Atherton Chong welcomed members and guests and provided a brief history of Central Union Church. Her explanation of the stained glass windows in the Parish Hall was of particular interest since they were the windows of the original church once located where the current Hawaii State Capitol building now stands.

WBM President Karen Welsh called the meeting to order and a praise hula was offered by Mama Kahu Mariah Davis. She was accompanied on guitar by Kahu Wendell Davis.

The president introduced special guests before conducting the business portion of the meetings, where the 141<sup>st</sup> Annual Meeting Minutes were approved, written reports received, and oral reports were given by Finance Chairwoman Eleanore Atherton Chong, Membership Chairwoman Kathleen Mumford, Missions Chairwoman Melinda Ahn, President Karen Welsh, and Executive Director Clara D. Priester. WBM supported missionary Caleb Ludwig also spoke for a few moments and thanked the membership for supporting his ministry to college students in Guam. Action Items including the approval of the 2013-2014 Proposed Operations Budget, Mission's Budget and Slate of Officers. The Reverend Gloria Imamura of Central Union Church formally installed and commissioned the officers to serve.

The Mother Alice Offering was conducted by a former recipient and WBM Member, the Reverend Youlida Yoruw, from Iao Congregational Church on Maui. WBM Spiritual Life Chair Lila Vailuu led the Necrology as we remembered members who have passed away this year.

The worship service was the highlight of the day as Tri-Isle Representative Kathleen Mumford led in a beautiful and heart rendering Call to Worship. Mama Kahu Mariah Davis offered another praise hula with her husband accompanying on guitar and was proceeded by an inspiring keynote address by Dr. Kuʻulei Serna.

Former Executive Director Carolyn Winston presented Mrs. Fesilafa'i Malae with her second "Never Underestimate the Power of a Christian Woman" award for more than 50 years of continuous service to the ministry.

A delicious lunch, fellowship, and lots of laughter followed the formal program of the day. There was much happiness and celebration in the festive atmosphere. The women agreed they are looking forward to another 142 years of service through this historic, yet vital ministry.

### FROM OUR KAUA'I VP REPRESENTATIVE

### LINDA SHIGETA



A new pay-it-forward type of leadership program for young adults was presented in a formal letter written by Meleane Moala appealing to our WBM for financial assistance at our February 2013 meeting. Meleane is a youth member at Lihue United Church, recent graduate and valedictorian of Kapaa High School, and serves on the KAUCC Standing Committee for Youth and Young Adults. The project was born of her desire to cultivate the Spirit in the lives of young people who also feel a strong desire to share Christ with others. It would also provide more training in

ministering to others and time to develop a deeper sense of their own call to Christian sharing. Meleane's high school senior project included a UCC pastor. She had gathered young women who were unchurched and through a weekend of prayer and conversation, exposed them to the heart of the Christian faith and the love and fellowship of Christ. This project, called the Sacred Day Walk and Apprenticeship, is to help inspire and energize our youth to live authentically. It will be a time for each one to just be with God, as he speaks in life-giving ways through nature and prayer, and will be offered to 10 young adults ages 18-30. Four will be selected from Kauai. An estimated 100 youth, grades 6-12, will be served by apprentices from July 30 through August 3, 2013 at Koke'e State Park on Kauai. The Woman's Board of Missions blessed this project with a monetary gift of \$1,000.

The spring break Youth Camp on Kauai was a success and immensely appreciated by our youth and community. Their theme was *God is the Adventure*. The Woman's Board of Missions sponsored four Marshallese youth, while I joyfully sponsored three others. They camped at the Church of the Pacific in Princeville. Clint Snyder (Waimea United Church) and his brother in Christ, Jamie, were some of our youth leaders. Pastor Alpha Goto (Wai'oli Hui'ia Church) in Hanalei gave surfing lessons and the Hanalei Adult Canoe Team gave instructions in the art of canoe paddling. The youth also worked with the Church of the Pacific's food pantry and garden where, Andrea Kaohi (Hanapepe Hawaiian Congregational Church) was our outstanding cook.

The "Memoirs of Henry Obookiah" book launch was hosted at Lihue United Church on Thursday, March 21, 2013. The youth of our island and youngest member of our WBM, Kiara Maciel (Oahu), were a major focus and involved throughout the program. They could see truly the good works of our brother in Christ, Henry Opukaha'ia. A special thank you to the Reverend Dr. Nani Hill (Hanapepe Hawaiian Congregational Church) for the blessing of the book. Deborah Li'ikapeka Lee gave an inspiring presentation. Our Lord, the dedicated service of our WBM, and our Kauai churches made this gathering a success. I also presented two books as a love gift to the Friends of the Lihue Library. Thank you Jesus.

The KAUCC Youth Committee is in the process of developing funding and hiring a youth coordinator for UCC churches island wide.

I have reached out to individual leaders of the Marshallese UCC churches on our island and supported them by helping their concerns to be heard with the State Department of Health.

The mainstay of my calling is to reach our youth. I believe that our Father will see more of His will come to fruition in this coming year. Your prayers are appreciated.

Thanks be to our Father for the honor of serving as Kauai's VP Representative this year.

Melinda, Kiara, & Kaliko on the move

A group of our members, families and friends met at the Discovery Center at Kaka'ako Park. Myrtle and Sione brought sandwiches and musubi for the group. We ate, took pictures near a banyan tree, and then gathered together and prayed. Kaliko prayed that the people we visited would feel hope. My husband, Henry closed the prayer.

We began at Kaka'ako Park then headed downtown to River Street in Chinatown. People from Aala Park came to us. We spent a good bit of time on River Street, before heading to the parking lot at Kmart in Iwilei across from the Institute of Human Services. We distributed previously donated prescription eyeglasses and every single pair found a home with someone who really needed it. Some cried, as they were now able to read. I gave one man a Daily Bread devotional and he told me he was unable to read. All of the eyeglasses were gone by this time, so I happily gave him my own.

All 120 food goodie bags consisting of 2 eggs, a big juicy apple, almonds, a granola bar, chocolate nuggets, and a little candy in each were distributed. People were so appreciative and excited. It was the same when we distributed 150 toiletry goodie bags, towels, slippers, sheets, pillows, blankets, clothing, socks, diapers, teddy bears, Bibles, and 25 dozen hard-boiled eggs. Kaiulani brought and distributed cold water and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. People expressed so much gratitude for what many would consider small things.

One man was so excited that he called his social worker to tell her he had just been given slippers, a towel and clothing. He only had the clothes on his back. He stayed with us until we left. A woman approached Kaliko saying that she was ashamed that she was really hungry and was not worthy of our gifts. She confided that she was going to take a towel from the Salvation Army. Kaliko ran into Kmart and purchased a couple more towels. The woman's boyfriend was wearing a pair of slippers that had broken and were being held together by tape. She said that we were really a blessing! Kaliko told them that she wanted them to see that there really is hope.

Another woman in a small crowd approaching us asked if we were selling our things when she saw that we had a car, a van, and a truck filled with supplies. We told them that we had brought these things for them. They said that we were "awesome." Many people asked who we were and inquired if we were with any group. I let them know that we are the WBM! People were polite and thankful. They said that they were happy and that they were so grateful that we thought of them!

One of the things that really tugged at my heart was the experience that a man shared with me. He said that he had an apartment that was sold from under his family. He works and has enough to pay for rent, but did not have the extra money for a deposit on a new rental. He has a girlfriend and child and said that he did not want to be homeless and that he did not want a "hand out." He just needed some help. We were able to assist this family and he has contacted our office twice to report to Clara that he and his family were able to find a new place and were grateful to our WBM for treating his family with such kindness.

Thank you to the countless number of you who give consistently to our WBM. You help to make our homeless blessings and other missions projects possible.
